Assessor Erroll Williams: 2022 Assessment Rolls will be Open for Public Inspection July 15 through August 16
Appeals, Age/Disability Freeze and Homestead Exemption applications due by August 19

Assessor Erroll Williams is reminding Orleans Parish property owners that the 2022 assessment rolls will be open for public inspection July 15, 2021 through August 16, 2021, Mondays to Fridays, 8:30 a.m. - 4 p.m.

Anyone interested in meeting with office staff to discuss their property assessment is strongly encouraged to schedule an online or in-person meeting using the online scheduling system at nolaassessor.com or by calling 504.754.8811. The link to schedule appointments will go live the morning of July 14.

Walk-ins will be seen on a first come, first served basis if there are appointments available for that day.

If a property owner does not want to discuss their assessment with staff and would rather submit a formal appeal to the Board of Review (BOR), an appeal can be submitted on the E-FILE page at nolaassessor.com from July 19, 2021 until 4 p.m., August 19, 2021.

Property owners may alternatively download and print the appropriate BOR form from the "Forms" page on nolaassessor.com. Please be advised that you must submit four (4) copies of the BOR appeal form and all supporting materials for BOR appeal submissions by hand or mail.

REMEMBER: THE OPEN ROLLS PROCESS WILL END AT EXACTLY 4PM ON MONDAY, AUGUST 16, SO GIVE YOURSELF ENOUGH TIME TO SCHEDULE AN APPOINTMENT BEFORE THAT DATE. YOU MAY FILE AN APPEAL THROUGH 4PM AUGUST 19.

OFFICE GUIDELINES FOR COVID-19

- All members of the public, and employees of OPAO when meeting with the public, are required to wear mask at all times when at the Assessor's Office, its satellite locations and hearing rooms.

- The Office reserves the right to deny entry to anyone who is exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19 and reserves the right to take the temperature of any member of the public attempting to enter the OPAO offices and/or hearing rooms.
